The Greyhound Adoption Program (GAP) QLD is run by the Queensland Racing Integrity Commission (QRIC) and is dedicated to finding homes for greyhounds that have retired from racing or are otherwise in need of a family.

HELPFUL GREYHOUND CARE TIPS Osteoarthritis in greyhounds



Greyhounds have thin skin and very little body fat making them more susceptible to cold weather. This means their body often has to 'work harder' to keep warm, that more energy is required during the winter months so, their diet may need to be adjusted. Your greyhound may also be more at risk of injury when cold.

What can you do to help?

- Ensure your greyhound is kept warm when the weather gets cold.
- If sleeping outside, provide a raised bed that is not on the ground, and appropriate shelter free from leaks and draughts.
- Provide your greyhound with a warm coat or jacket, especially in the evenings and overnight. If your greyhound isn't used to wearing a jacket, we recommend starting with a simple coat that just slips over their head and ties around their waist. This is also helpful for greyhounds that don't enjoy having their feet or legs touched. Giving lots of treats and encouraging them to wear a coat can be a positive experience.
- Monitor your greyhound's weight, body condition and skin/coat health.



If you notice a decline in any of the above, you may need to increase your greyhound's daily food intake. This may still occur even if you are keeping your greyhound warm.

Adopt milestones: the 3-3-3 rule



Every greyhound is unique and adjusting to life as a pet takes time. GAP greyhounds are retired athletes and bringing one home can feel a bit like welcoming a puppy — it's a time of discovery, patience and new routines.

That's where the 3-3-3 rule comes in:

Three days. Your greyhound is likely feeling overwhelmed and unsure. Give them time to decompress, explore their new space and start to feel safe. **Three weeks.** By now, your greyhound will begin to settle in, learn your

household routine and understand some basic boundaries.

Three months. This is when your greyhound will truly begin to feel at home. Their personality will emerge and a strong bond will start to form.

Remember, patience and consistency go a long way. The rewards are well worth it.

GREEN COLLAR ASSESSMENT 💙



If you didn't adopt your greyhound with GAP, did you know you can still have your retired racer assessed for a green collar?

Green collar accreditation provides an exemption from muzzling in a local council area where muzzling would otherwise be required under the *Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008*.
