The Greyhound Adoption Program (GAP) QLD is run by the Queensland Racing Integrity Commission (QRIC) and is dedicated to finding homes for greyhounds that have retired from racing or are otherwise in need of a family.

HELPFUL GREYHOUND CARE TIPS Osteoarthritis in greyhounds



Osteoarthritis is a degenerative joint disease. It's a progressive inflammation caused by the breakdown of joint cartilage which usually acts as a cushion, allowing the joint to move through its natural range of motion. Osteoarthritis can develop in younger greyhounds due to their athletic history prior to retirement.

To minimise the risk of osteoarthritis, ensure your greyhound has regular veterinary checkups (especially as they age), maintain an active lifestyle and healthy weight, and have appropriate nutrition.

Early identification is key to ensure appropriate management is initiated to help keep your greyhound active and maintain a good quality of life.

Common signs of osteoarthritis:

Stiffness, lameness/limping, difficulty getting up particularly on cooler days

- Lethargy
- Reluctance to run, jump, use stairs or play
- Weight gain
- Irritability or changes in behaviour
- · Pain when petted or touched
- Unusual licking or chewing over certain areas
- Difficulty posturing to toilet or having accidents
- Loss of muscle mass over limbs or spine
- Know your dog's normal, so you notice the abnormal!

Always consult your local vet if you think your greyhound may be showing signs of arthritis or you aren't sure. There are many treatment options available, and the vet will help tailor a program specifically for your greyhound.

NEWS FROM THE SEQ GAP TEAM Morning feeding time

Every morning the dogs are taken for a short toilet walk and then put into individual empty out yards where they are given their breakfast and watch the birds and the rising sun whilst their kennels are cleaned.



We feed our greys Royal Canin Maxi and they receive between 1 1/2 to 2 cups depending on the size of the dog (and who's on a diet). We always recommend high grade kibble as they have different dietary requirements to some other breeds and can lose weight easily if not given good quality food.



Some of our dogs are a little fussy and require a little "extra". We sometimes try a couple of combinations until we get it Goldilocks just right. Slow feeders are also needed for those in too much of a hurry to finish.



Once the food is loaded up, the familiar rattle of the food trolly leaving the kitchen signals BREAKFAST TIME!

GREYHOUND BEHAVIOUR **Socialisation**

Why is socialisation so important?

Socialisation helps to create a stable foundation in building relationships, through their interactions with new dogs and people and being exposed to new and different situations. This helps to create a much more confident and adaptable individual.



What is socialisation?

Socialisation involves exposing your greyhound to different experiences such as people, children, dogs, environments and sounds. Some ways are listed below:

- Taking your greyhound to a different park or simply going the opposite direction on your regular trail/walk.
- Taking them to Bunnings, the beach, lake or dog friendly cafés.
- Friends and family coming over for a visit or going to a friend's place for a playdate.
- Being exposed to different noises such as trains, ferry's, bike bells and different animals they may not have heard or seen before such as cows, birds etc.

Always start slowly and with short, controlled interactions, moving at your greyhound's individual pace.

Watch your greyhound's body language as everyone is different and what is okay for another dog may be too much for yours. Always temper any new interaction or experiences to your greyhound's personality as some are big homebodies and not keen on going to cafés and busy parks, but like the more sedate and quiet outings.

Associate any new interaction or experience with positive things like treats, lots of praise or playtime afterwards to assist in them associating this potentially scary new experience as something positive.

GREEN COLLAR ASSESSMENT





If you didn't adopt your greyhound with GAP, did you know you can still have your retired racer assessed for a green collar?

Green collar accreditation provides an exemption from muzzling in a local council area where muzzling would otherwise be required under the Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008.
