HELPFUL GREYHOUND CARE TIPS Dental Disease



Dental disease is the most common health issue in greyhounds. They are genetically predisposed to periodontitis, with at least 40% of greyhounds reported to have some form of dental disease throughout their lifespan. It is vital to implement a routine dental care plan to ensure the health and welfare of your greyhound. Poor dental health has been linked to other systemic issues including heart, liver and kidney disease.

Making Friends: Easy Tips to Socialise Your Greyhound

Socialising your greyhound is one of the best gifts you can give them — it helps build confidence, reduces anxiety, and creates a happy, well-adjusted pup. Whether your grey is a curious dog or a gentle giant, these simple tips will make meeting new friends a breeze!

- Start early: Begin socialising your greyhound as soon as you can.
- Introduce gradually: Let your greyhound approach new people at their own pace using calm, gentle interactions.
- Safe dog meetings: Arrange introductions with calm dogs in controlled, quiet spaces and watch for signs of stress.
- Positive reinforcement: Reward calm behaviour around new people and dogs with treats and praise.
- Keep it short: Limit new experiences to short, positive sessions to avoid overwhelming your dog.
- Join meetups and greyhound walks: Participate in greyhound-specific groups to socialise them with similar dogs.
- Explore new places: Expose your greyhound to varied environments to boost confidence.
- Be patient: Consistency and patience are key—every greyhound adjusts at their own pace.

Remember, every greyhound is unique, and socialisation is a journey, not a race. With patience, kindness, and a few tasty treats, your greyhound will soon be happily wagging tails and making new friends everywhere you go!

GREEN COLLAR ASSESSMENT





If you didn't adopt your greyhound through GAP, did you know you can still have your retired racer assessed for a green collar?

Green collar accreditation provides an exemption from muzzling in a local council area where muzzling would otherwise be required under the Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008.

Our adoption fee is \$100. All GAP greyhounds have a uniquely numbered green collar, are desexed, heartworm tested, receive a full dental assessment including a scale and polish, are vaccinated, microchipped, and they come to you with up-to-date flea, tick and worming treatments and a Greyhound starter kit to assist you on your adoption journey.

All GAP greyhounds receive lifetime registration with Central Animal Records microchip registry. More information on our adoption process can be found here.
